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PURPOSE

The Harris Plan is intended to be the template to enable public sector organisations in Harris to work together, share resources and improve services.

The purpose of the plan is to portray development needs from the following areas:

- **Housing**
- **Transport**
- **Employment**
- **Education**
- **Healthcare**
- **Communications**



Agent

The Harris Forum has representation from community groups, land trusts and other agencies across the whole of Harris.

The aim of the Forum, since its first meeting on the 3rd of October 2017, is to facilitate an environment where member groups can discuss, share and encourage one another.

At each meeting of the Harris Forum the Harris Plan is updated as it is a live working document.

The Isle of Harris

The Isle of Harris forms the southern part of Lewis and Harris, the largest island in the Outer Hebrides, situated 25 miles Northwest of the Isle of Skye and 40 miles west of mainland Scotland.

Most of the land is in community ownership, with North and West Harris community estates responsible for 33,125 hectares of some of the most rugged and scenic landscapes in Europe.

According to the latest 2011 Census statistics 1916 people reside in Harris and Scalpay in 911 homes, with 41% being one-person households. The death rate outstrips the birth rate by 2.3:1 and the age profile is skewed towards the elderly with 33% over 65, 14% under 15 and 53% aged between 16 and 64.

Background to the Harris Plan

The Harris Plan 2021-2025 follows on from Our Plan for Harris 2015-2020 and the earlier Isle of Harris Local Outcome Agreement 2010-2015 (HLOA) which was authored by Harris Development Limited. The HLOA illustrated the short, medium- and long-term development aspirations for Harris. Our Plan for Harris 2015-2020 further realised these aspirations and detailed 71 projects which were in various phases of development within Harris. A number of these plans have been completed, whilst others are in a range of development phases. It should also be recognised that some projects proved unfeasible and either had to be adapted or removed from the plan.

Early in 2015 a group of representatives from community development organisations, land trusts, community councils and other community representatives across Harris met to consider a new 2020 plan for Harris that would incorporate the priorities of the community owned estates with wider community priorities. In March 2015, recognising that work had already started on a locality plan, the group was approached by the Outer Hebrides Community Planning Partnership (OHCPP) to take part in a pilot “to identify aspirations and priorities, and how the partners can add value, by working in closer partnership with a specific community.”

This led on to the formation of the Harris Forum.

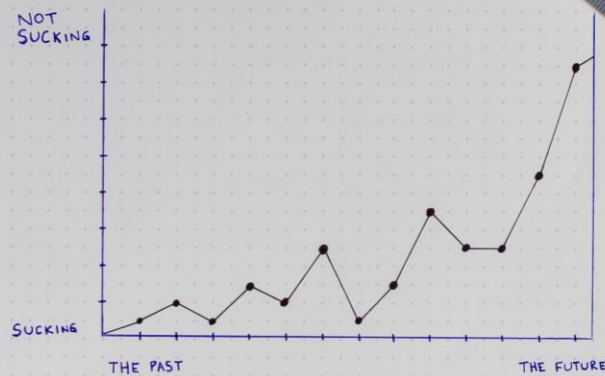
Prioritisation Matrix

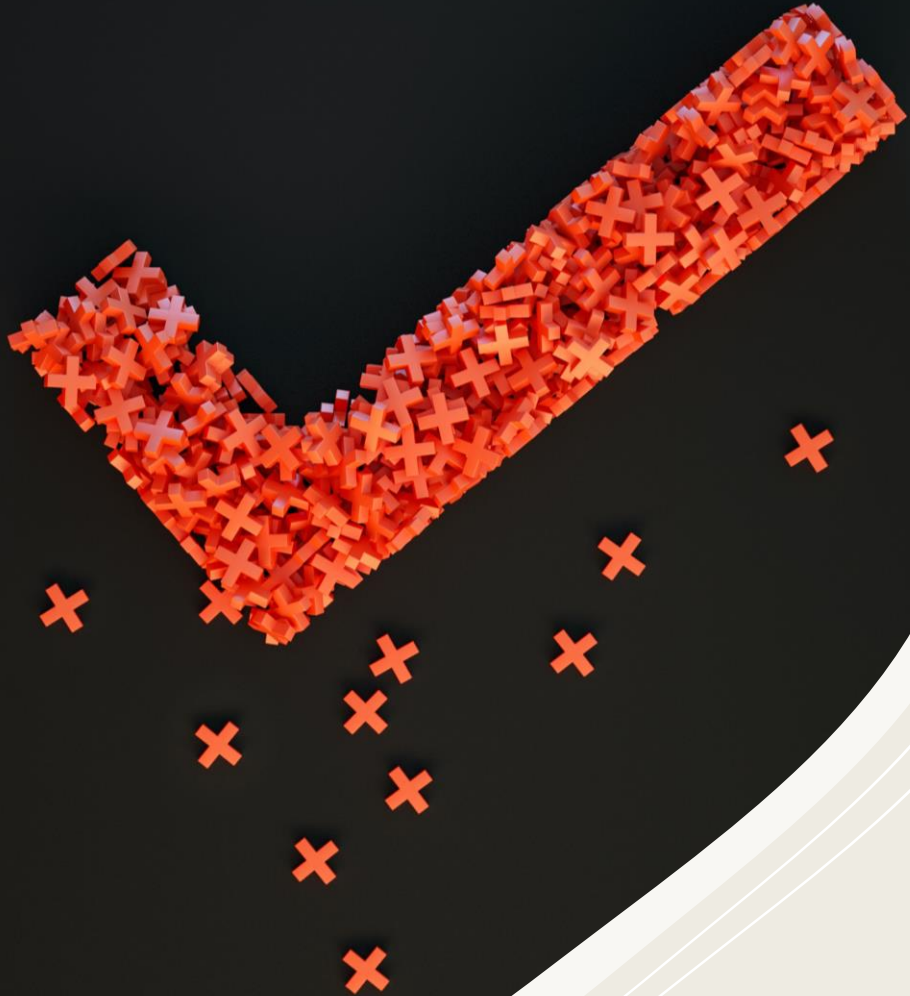

The following show just a few examples of completed projects over the years.

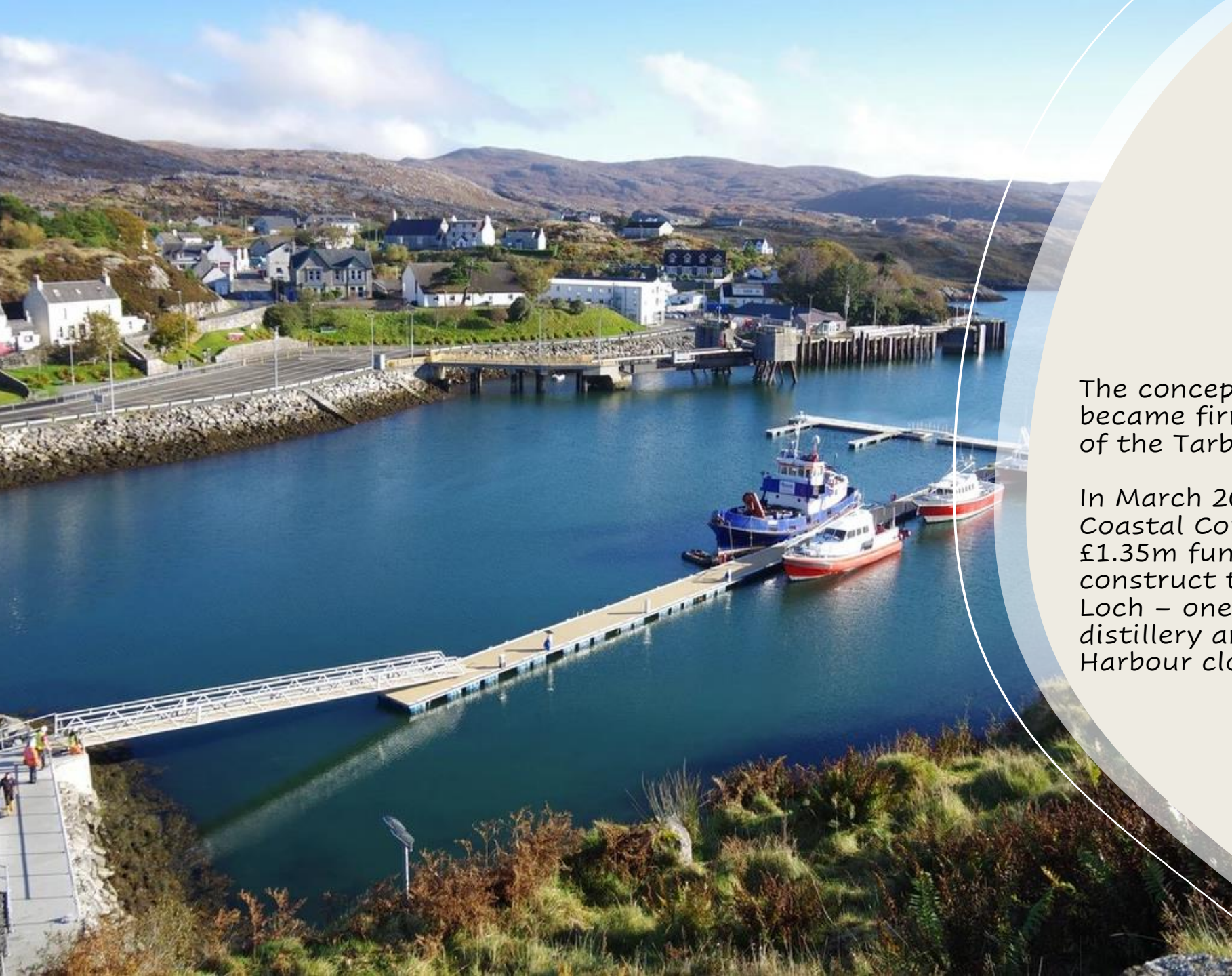


NORTH HARRIS TRUST - UPGRADE TRAILS

A project to upgrade trails, construct a wildlife observatory and interpretation at Ardvourlie Woodland which was completed in the Autumn of 2020 alongside the Ardvourlie Common Grazings Committee.

It was a project aimed at getting more people involved in healthy activity whilst also being a benefit to tourists.





HARRIS DEVELOPMENT LTD - ISLE OF HARRIS MARINA

The concept of a marina in East Loch Tarbert became firmly established through the efforts of the Tarbert Pier Users Association.

In March 2017, the award of £300k from the Coastal Communities Fund completed the £1.35m funding package required to construct two sets of pontoons in the East Loch – one at Tarbert adjacent to the new distillery and the other at Scalpay's North Harbour close to the Scalpay Bistro.

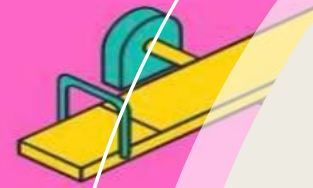


WEST HARRIS TRUST - ADDITIONAL CAMPSITE

A project to add additional campsite space next to Talla na Mara that offers electrical hook up, rubbish and recycling facilities, water supply and a chemical toilet disposal point.

SCALPAY COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION - UPGRADE PLAYPARK FACILITIES

A project to renovate the playpark at Scalpay as a key resource for families and making the park once again a safe place for children to enjoy outdoors.

A decrease in the younger population of Scalpay resulted in the local school closing in 2012 but the trend has since reversed and now more than 30 local children as well as the extended local community will benefit from the refurbishment of the park.
